AZ Sint-Jan Bruges-Ostend is bursting with ambition. As the biggest hospital in West Flanders – the only Flemish province without a university hospital - it wants to take on the role of a reference centre that offers innovative care to citizens of all ranks and classes. 'Approximately 40% of our activity is related to surgery,' says Director-General Dr. Hans Rigauts. 'A well-organised operating theatre that uses the right resources and expertise fits our strategy like a glove. Our surgery already has a reputation throughout the country for oral & maxillofacial surgery and bariatric surgery, and we are spearheading cardiac and neurosurgery, as well as robot surgery for urological and gynaecological interventions, plus thyroid gland surgery in the near future.'

Such ambition inevitably raises the issue of finance and the cost framework. The operating theatre already has 15 operating rooms and an extension of 3 new surgery rooms is forcing the organisation to look for the ideal combination of competency and high-end technology to achieve the reference ambitions on the one hand, and finance the desired patient care on the other. Efficiency is the key word, according to Dr. Rigauts. 'That certainly applies to the operating theatre. An efficient operating theatre runs on realistic planning, which is connected seamlessly to the patient flow in the hospital,' he says.

Oral & Maxillofacial: 'A huge time saving'

Maxillofacial Surgeon Dr. Maurice Mommaerts agrees: 'the operating schedule is quite busy at present. The number of operations increases by 10% each year, but our O.R. capacity remains the same. This is why it is essential for us to be able to save time between two operations and the Mölnlycke procedure trays solution really fills the need. The circulating nurse finishes preparing the next intervention much more guickly with the ready-to-use Mölnlycke procedure trays. Before Mölnlycke procedure trays, considerable time was lost getting the right single-use materials because the items that were pre-collected for the intervention were not always the right ones.' This issue has been completely eliminated with the custom made Mölnlycke procedure trays. There is a consultation twice a year between the Head Nurse Logistics and Mölnlycke to evaluate the composition of the trays, but Dr. Mommaerts observes that there were hardly any changes made to them in the past year. 'I can only give one piece of advice to operating theatres that want to switch to Mölnlycke procedure trays: be sure to do it. The time saving is huge.'

The time saving does not impact all types of interventions to the same extent. The surgery department makes a distinction between three types of interventions, for which the

development of Mölnlycke[®] procedure trays has been prioritised. Firstly, there are the highly-frequent interventions in day surgery, which are usually short in duration but occur frequently, such as knee arthroscopies. With these, minimising the set-up time between operations is crucial for the schedule. 'We work with pre and post-anaesthesia rooms, which leads to high numbers of operations and an efficient way of working', explains Head Nurse Logistics lene Gevaert. 'But Mölnlycke procedure trays can contribute to even greater efficiency because the circulating nurse can free up more time for the next patient or can assist the scrub nurse in the operating room.' Filip Pareyn, Head Nurse Surgery, also notes that the nurse can dedicate more time to the patient. 'We can approach the patients more calmly, inform and reassure them in a better way, which reinforces the feeling of well-being."

Less running about for complex procedures

A second type of interventions, for which Mölnlycke procedure trays have recently been developed, are the very complex operations, such as heart surgery or robot surgery. As lene Gevaert explains: 'Robot-controlled interventions are usually very complex and demand a substantial preparation time. It is an enormous advantage for the circulating nurse to have everything available in a single Mölnlycke procedure trays and to be able to drape the robot properly.'

Finally, urgent interventions also qualified, such as caesarean sections or trepanation in neurosurgery, where the nurse has little time to prepare the operation and must primarily concentrate on getting the patient ready. In this respect, Cardiac Surgery Nurse Nick Tant thinks that Mölnlycke procedure trays eliminates a great deal of frustration for the scrub nurse: 'In an emergency situation you want to have everything that the surgeon needs on the table immediately. It is frustrating and unacceptable to keep a surgeon waiting because a draping set is unavailable, for example.'

Operational safety is the key term here according to Heart Surgeon Dr. Paul Verrelst: 'The advantage of a custom made Mölnlycke procedure tray is that also a less experienced circulating nurse can drape the patient safely and quickly, even outside the operating room. This helps, for example, when we put a patient on extracorporeal membrane oxygenation in an emergency procedure.' Filip Pareyn, Head Nurse Surgery, expands the argument to newcomers: 'The use of Mölnlycke procedure trays is a plus point for new staff. They know for sure that everything that is needed is included in the tray and that they will not have to start looking for anything in the sometimes hectic conditions in an operating theatre. This certainly gives a reassuring feeling to a newcomer.'

A pleasant working atmosphere

The fact that the Mölnlycke procedure trays offer certainty about the materials is reassuring in the O.R., but also offers asepsis advantages, according to Dr. Verrelst. 'There are three important advantages of the use of Mölnlycke procedure trays: the time-saving effect when preparing for the intervention; the time saving aspect of staff not walking around nervously looking for the right equipment; and a hygiene advantage because there is less dust formation now that we no longer use textile fabrics and now that there is less movement in and out of the operating room.' Dr. Mommaerts points out that the peace of mind is also important for doctors: 'when a Mölnlycke procedure trays is opened, everyone knows what it contains. Even when the circulating nurse is new, you as a surgeon know that you have the right materials readily at hand. Mölnlycke procedure trays contribute to a pleasant work environment, less stress and better use of time - in one word, efficiency.'
